- Good Practice 1: Adopting PPP Model to improve Quality of Services in Dongri Observation Home
 - The WCD Dept., Govt. of Maharashtra has signed a CSR MoU with JSW Foundation and Children Aid Society to take up various activities of quality enhancement at Dongri Observation Home in Mumbai
 - This PPP model has helped the department in ensuring better Health and Hygiene along with improved look and feel in the premises of the home
 - This model has also ensured that the children have access to a holistic development by way of Sports Activities, Wall Painting, Cultural Programmes and Industrial Excursions etc.
 - As part of this MoU, Children Aid Society and JSW Foundation are working together for Implementation of Skill Development activities and other Vocational Activities for Children.





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- Good Practice 2: Implementation of Kitchen Garden
 - While providing Micronutrient rich diet to the children, it is equally important to have a sustainable and low cost source of Vegetables and Fruits from within the premises.
 - With this in mind, the Observation Home in collaboration with JSW has setup a Kitchen Garden in the premises
 - The experts from JSW Foundation are helping in development as well as maintenance of the Kitchen Garden.
 - Most importantly, this initiative is being implemented with active involvement of children to ensure the children get Skill Development in Kitchen Garden. It will also instill a sense of participation in running the key affairs of the Observation Home
